Installation Guide



Liebert Liqui-tect™ Leak Detection Sensors install quickly and work simply for reliable detection of leaks.


The Liqui-tect 410 Sensor should be placed at critical points on the floor. Two corrosion-resistant, gold-plated probes sense the presence of aqueous liquids.


When a leak is detected, dual Form-C relay outputs can simultaneously signal a local alarm panel and a remote monitoring system. The Liqui-tect 410 Sensor features supervised operation: circuit failure or loss of power are detected and indicated as alarm conditions, providing a completely selfmonitored leak detection system.

DIMENSIONS -TOP, FRONT AND SIDE







As shown in the illustration on page 2, Liqui-tect 410 (LT410) may be placed on a subfloor within the leak detection zone—the area directly beneath the unit being protected or other areas such as the unit drip pan or ceiling pipe trays.

The LT410 requires a 24 VAC power supply either from the environmental unit or an external source. There are two sets of Form-C dry contacts for connection to a Liebert thermalmanagement unit and an external monitoring panel.


NOTES

WIRING INTERCONNECTIONS

Circuits are shown in powered, non-alarm state.

NOTE: All power and alarm connections must be Class 2 circuits.




Red Wires	Orange Wires	Yellow Wires




POWER WIRING

The LT410 is rated for 24 VAC, 50/60 Hz, and 0.10 A.







WIRING TO AUXILIARY ALARM PANELS

The LT410 has two Form-C dry contact alarm output contacts: orange wires (1) and yellow wires (2). Each contact is rated for 24 VAC at 3 amp.



Note: Terminal 50 not available on Mini-Mate2 (8-ton)





NOTE: In iCOM, use the Service Options menu to add that the Liqui-tect is installed.
